2xEP and INNOVATION

A2SE has recognised that to double our energy productivity (or more) by 2030 we will need to harness the wave of technology and new business models offering substantial EP improvement that are best practices globally now, as well as new technology being developed and commercialised over the next 15 years. We are gathering resources to develop an innovation roadmap which aims to identify the major technology shifts likely in this area in the next 15 years in each end use sector of the economy, provide learning cost curves, define barriers to their implementation and examine policies that can accelerate their deployment. We will do this work collaboratively with ISF and our 2xEP research partners, and are seeking funding sources at present. With suitable funding we would aim to get our first roadmap together by August (in time for our economy wide 2xEP launch).

“Clean Jobs” in the USA... and implications for Australia

recent [Clean Jobs America](#) report published by Environmental Entrepreneurs (E2) and BW Research partnership (seemingly funded by the Clean Energy Trust), which is relevant to some of the projects we proposed in the CRC-P (EP Industry Survey and Economic Assessment). Some points of note:

- More than 2.5 million people are employed in US clean energy
 - Energy efficiency accounts for 3/4 of America's clean energy jobs (1.9 million)
- summary of policy drivers from page 11-15 and the methodology in brief is on page 17.
